



Constable Martinez was born and raised in Houston's Near Northside with two brothers and three sisters. He attended Robert E. Lee Elementary School, now the Leonel Castillo Community Center, John Marshall Junior High School and Jefferson Davis Senior High School.

He began his law enforcement career in 1989 with the Texas Department of Criminal Justice working as a "Field Boss" supervising inmates outside the prison compound. He attended the Houston Community College Police Academy in 1992 and upon graduation he became a Police Officer with the Houston Community College Police Department. He earned promotions through the ranks from police officer to Detective then Sergeant of Investigations/Internal Affairs, where he supervised investigations and also members of the communications division. He was assigned as the department liaison with the U.S. Secret Service (High Tech Task Force). He later earned promotion to the rank of lieutenant where he commanded the Northeast Houston sector. He was also responsible for managing the department's Training Division ensuring all departmental personnel remained in compliance with both State of Texas and departmental training mandates. Another proud achievement was he created and led the department's first Honor Guard detail.

Constable Martinez holds the highest achievable State of Texas peace officer license - Master Peace Officer. He has also earned Instructor's Certification which permits him to teach and share his knowledge. He is a graduate of the Houston Community College's Leadership Excellence Institute and has completed extensive training in Emergency Management and the federal National Incident Management System. He has also completed extensive training in the areas of Internal Affairs through the nationally recognized Bill Blackwood Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas at Sam Houston State University.
